The first impression you make in an interview is going to be based on how you look and what you are wearing. Remember that your appearance alone will not get you a job, but it can stop you from getting one.

On any given day, we may have employers recruiting or media doing a story on the local labor market at our facility. We ask that our customers dress professionally, even when stopping by the career center briefly.

ACCEPTABLE

- Business suits, skirts, blouses, dresses and dress slacks
- Casual slacks, skirts, blouses and dress that are neat, clean and fit properly for a professional environment. Slacks should be worn at waistline with a belt.
- Capris that are neat, clean and fit properly for a professional environment
- Dress shoes, work shoes, athletic sneakers (Must be clean and in good condition/shoes with laces, must be tied)

NOT ACCEPTABLE

- Dirty and torn clothing
- Barefoot, or wearing shower sandals, slippers or flip-flops
- Shower caps and bonnets on head
- Tank-tops, halter-tops or revealing shirts or blouses, (beaters), sheer clothing or shirts that expose the midriff
- Shorts (except dress shorts)
- Spaghetti-strapped shirts
- Miniskirts/dresses that are too short or tight.
- Exercise clothing (no spandex)
- Sleepwear
- T-Shirts with inappropriate or offensive images or wording
- Pants not pulled up to the waist
